Message from the Chair


Each charity received a cheque for £427.

The Annual Parish Meeting

The Elmore Annual Parish meeting took place on Thursday 5th June in the Village Hall. It was attended by 13 parishioners, 5 councillors and our special guest speaker was Neil Carmichael MP.

Neil Carmichael gave a short address covering the main topics of Flooding and Rural Broadband. In this statement he emphasised the Government’s commitment to protect homes and invest more money in flood defences country-wide as well as the promise of producing 90% coverage for faster rural broadband and 100% coverage with a minimum of 2MB download speeds by the end of 2015. After his statement he answered questions from the floor on a wide range of

topics but mostly centred on the problems of flooding that affected Elmore and the problems of house insurance as well as the idea of subdividing the Environment Agency so that it could perform its function more efficiently. He also promised to send us a copy of the latest Government Water Bill which laid out the figures for investment in flood defences for the future. Neil Carmichael was warmly thanked by the Chair for attending and addressing our concerns.

A précis of the Chairman's Annual Statement is shown below:

Finance

“For the 4th year in a row the Parish Council decided not to increase the Parish Precept. Despite this decision we have managed to maintain a healthy financial situation as well as investing in some improvements within the Village.

We still believe that during the ‘recession’ it would not right to either increase the precept or embark on expensive projects.

At the end of the 2013/2014 Financial Year our bank balance stood at £4,950 of which we have ring-fenced the sum of £1,300 as a Contingency Fund and £600 for maintenance of the Millennium Ponds thus leaving a figure of £3,000 available for future projects such as the purchase of a defibrillator for the Village.”

Local Elections

“This year saw the retirement from Stroud District Council of Graham Littleton after some 14 years as a Councillor – thanks to Graham for all his sterling work on our behalf. Many people won't realise what goes on behind the scenes but I can assure you all that Graham has worked tirelessly on our behalf.

All the seats on the Parish Council were due for election this year.

However, as there were not enough nominations to warrant an election, all those who put in their papers were deemed elected.

One of our councillors, Clare Stewart, has stepped down after 14 years as a Parish Councillor. I will be sorry to see her leave as I valued her support and advice while we've worked together and thank her most sincerely for her time, dedication and voluntary service on behalf of the village.

After an unsuccessful advertising campaign we now have a new Parish Clerk – Dorie Jones - who agreed to take on the post last December having carried out the duties on a voluntary basis for the previous 6 months.”

Severn Estuary Flood Risk Management

“The EA’s ‘consultation’ on their Flood Risk Strategy took place in July 2013 following extensive discussions by the Severn Voice Task Group. Although it was termed a ‘Strategy’, there were no actual proposals in this document but only a selection of possible options. So we are none the wiser as to what will happen to our flood defences in the future.

In February this year your Parish Council wrote to the PM to state our concerns about the future and the regulations which govern the way in which the EA allocate funding to projects. Sadly the reply came from an official in Defra and did not answer our concerns.

You have heard from our MP, Neil Carmichael, that there is to be some extra funding committed to flood defences in our area. This is welcome news but we believe that the problem lies in Government Policy formulated by this and previous governments which dictate the rules by which the EA operate. At the end of the day the problem centres on money and the way in which the EA are prepared to look at the cost effectiveness of the situation. No account is taken of the true value of the farmland, the food production potential, local businesses or employment so the whole of Elmore Back could go under water as a result. BUT the rules permit the EA to squander upwards of £20 million on creating a wildlife habitat!

On this issue, The Severn Voice Task Group is continuing to engage with the EA, the Minister responsible, our MP our MEP and other stakeholders such as the Lower Severn Drainage Board and the NFU as well as GCC and SDC.”
