Financial         Statement	<ul> <li>Many library and youth centres are being run by volunteers as there is no funding for them.</li> <li>Longney School is looking for a School Governor.</li> <li>There is to be a GCC Planning meeting on the 21<sup>st</sup> March 2013 at the Gloucester Rugby Ground for the Javelin Park Incinerator. This is where the decision will be made.</li> <li>TB left after this item.</li> <li>Financial Statement: The balance sheet shows a healthy balance of £3,565.59 of which £1,665.59 is available for use as £1,300 remains ringfenced as a contingency fund and £600 remains ring-fenced for pond maintenance.</li> <li>Precept:</li> <li>At the last meeting, the Precept was frozen for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year in a row and this remains the case. 	<ul> <li>households claiming Housing Support.</li> <li>The clerk received an email from SDC on the 25<sup>th</sup> February 2013 asking if Elmore Parish Council would like to receive a Council Tax Support Grant and we were required to make a decision by 1<sup>st</sup> March 2013. JF made the decision that we would not accept the grant based on the following: <ul> <li>As we do not yet have the visibility of any reduction in our Precept for the FY 13/14, it was difficult to gauge whether or not there would be any reduction and the likely knock-on effect this might have on us.</li> <li>The grant was not guaranteed for future years so anything we receive this year might change, or stop, in subsequent years.</li> <li>Any grant we claimed could be passed on to the Parishioners and this last factor was not in line with our current policy of not increasing the Precept during the recession.</li> <li>Furthermore, if the Grant was to be reduced in future years the Council Tax could be increased with no increase in the Precept.</li> <li>We can still increase householder's precept contributions in future years if the need arises.</li> <li>Therefore JF declined the offer, however this was discussed at the Parish Council Meeting and all councillors agreed.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
