9. Chairman's Annual Statement*	Parish Precept and Finances For the 4th year in a row the Parish Council decided not to increase the Parish Precept. Despite this decision we have managed to maintain a healthy financial situation as well as investing in some improvements within the Village, including: New Notice Board by Village Hall Repairs to the War memorial (with the help of Elmore Land Charity) Set up and published the Parish Website Self help on making and erecting several open notice boards around the village We still believe that during the 'recession' it would not be right to either increase the precept or embark on expensive projects. At the end of the FY our bank balance stood at £ 4,950 of which we have ring-fenced the sum of £1,300 as a Contingency Fund and £600 for maintenance of the Millennium Ponds thus leaving a figure of £3,000 available for future projects Local Elections This year saw the retirement from Stroud District Councillor – thanks to Graham for all his sterling work on our behalf. Many people won't realise what goes on behind the scenes but I can assure you all, that Graham has worked tirelessly on our behalf. Graham's newly elected successor, Dave Mossman from Hardwicke, couldn't make our meeting. Parish Council All the seats on the Parish Council were due for election this year. However, as there were not enough nominations to warrant an election, all those who put in their papers were deemed elected on 22nd May. One of our councillors, Clare Stewart, has stepped down after 14 years as a Parish Councillor. I will be sorry to see her leave as I valued her support and advice while we've worked together and thank her most sincerely for her time, dedication and voluntary service on behalf of the village. The new Parish Council now comprises myself, Andy Nash, Trevor Jones, Jenni Hobbs and our new councillor, Nick Meek.

	The Environment Agency's Severn Estuary Flood Risk	
	Management Proposals	
	The EA's 'consultation' on their Flood Risk Strategy took place in	
	July 2013 following extensive discussions by the Severn Voice	
	Task Group. Although it was termed a 'Strategy', there were no	
	actual proposals in this document but only a selection of possible	
	options. So we are none the wiser as to what will happen to our	
	flood defences in the future. Some of you will recall the well	
	attended meeting held here last summer.	
	The EA finally published the results of their consultation and it	
	was disappointing to discover that only 62 responses were	
	received by the EA from the whole of the Severn Estuary. They	
	conveniently forgot about all those people who visited their 'road shows' and made comments in the visitors' books.	
	Since the consultation we learnt that the EA intended to stop	
	maintenance on the 4km flood defences around Elmore and say	
	they will be 'engaging' with landowners in order to work out a	
	solution for funding any maintenance work required. Despite	
	these assertions - there has been no engagement!!	
	In February this year your Parish Council wrote to the PM to state	
	our concerns about the future and the regulations which govern	
	the way in which the EA allocate funding to projects. (a <i>copy is</i>	
	available electronically)	
	You have heard from our MP, Neil Carmichael, that there is extra	
	funding committed to flood defences in our area. However,	
	despite all our efforts to date we have had no formal assurances	
	from the EA that any of this money will actually be spent on the	
	local flood defences either in the form of maintenance or	
	improvement.	
	More on this topic later in the meeting. New Water Main	
	Severn Trent installed a new water main throughout most of the	
	village. Although there were a few teething problems it seems to	
	have been a success.

12. The Precept for	At our last Parish Council meeting we set the Precept for 2014/15

	Our forecast of expenditure for this coming year covers the	
	regular items such as insurance, Clerk's wages and membership of	

professional bodies. However, this year we have the maintenance of the Parish Website and the cost of the Newsletter. In addition, we have the aspiration to obtain one and maybe even two	
Defibrillators as part of our Emergency Plan. These will be expensive items – in the region of £1,000 each - and the purchase	
will require some more research.

17. SEFRMS This topic was covered in the Chairman's annual statement but JF	
Update* added that despite our frustrations at the lack of a solution, we do not have a battle with the EA. We believe that regardless of what our MP said	
the problem lies in Government Policy formulated by this and	
previous governments which dictate the rules by which the EA	
operate.	
At the end of the day the problem centres on money and the way	
in which the EA are prepared to look at the cost effectiveness of	
the situation. No account is taken of the true value of the	
farmland, the food production potential, local businesses or	
employment. Therefore the livelihood and propertied of those	
living adjacent to the river could be threatened. However, the	
rules permit the EA to 'squander' upwards of £20 million	
creating a wildlife habitat yet the cost of improving a 10km length	
of the defences is in the region of £7m!	
JF (Chairman) is a member of the Severn Voice Task Group on	
this issue and they are continuing to engage with the EA, the	
Minister responsible, our MP our MEP and other stakeholders	
such as the Lower Severn Drainage Board and the NFU as well as	
GCC and SDC.	
18. The Elmore Discussion continued about defibrillators. JF recommended that a	
Village Emergency budget of £2,000 should be made available from the 2014/15

basic First Aid could show us how not to do the wrong thing. NM	
asked how safe would this First Aid training be. Questions were	
asked about security from theft of defibrillators and about the	
insurance to cover them.	
19. Broadband and JF made the following statement concerning telephones and	
telephone lines – Broadband. Over the last 6 years your Parish Council has been	
Update* engaged with BT and Open Reach in order to improve the	
telephone links into Elmore.	
Prior to our efforts there were over 30 homes that had shared	
lines and so were not able to obtain Broadband. Now nobody is on	
mics and so were not able to obtain broadband. Now hobody is on	

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	but unreliable, especially for those relying on it for business. Several years ago Open Reach engaged a contractor in order to attempt to drill under the canal to lay an extra cable from	
	Hardwicke Exchange to carry 100 addition telephone lines. Sadly this project was a disaster and after three attempts the drilling	
	mole disappeared so the project was aborted.	
	The latest Government initiative to provide Faster Broadband to	
	rural areas has added an extra dimension to our efforts. We discovered that Elmore and Longney were to be excluded from	
	this venture as the technical problems seemed too great.	
	However, BT has now relented and will be installing Faster	
	Broadband to the Street Cabinet situated at the junction of the	
	Longney turnoff this side of the Pilot. This will be done by firing a	
	microwave signal from the Hardwicke Exchange to a receiver by	
	the cabinet using a technique called 'Backhaul'. This will be the first installation of its type used in the UK and is a bit of an	
	experiment for BT.	
	The planning application for the erection of the receiving pole has already been submitted by BT to SDC and we have been promised that the Faster Broadband connection should be in place by the	
	end of the year.	
	JF commented he was reliably informed that this will be	
	minimum of 2 MBps compared to the 0.7 MBps he currently	
	receives. This should be a significant improvement. We have also asked BT to examine the possibility of upgrading the	
	underground and over ground telephone cables to either fibre	
	optic or a new copper system in order to reduce the resistance. No	
	promises have been made but BT has stated that they will	
	examine the possibility.	
	As ever, the devil will be in the detail. The signal will get to the	
	Street Cabinet but it is then up to individual households to	
	arrange a connection via their own Broadband provider. The cost of such a connection is not yet known!
