Elmore Parish Council started to compiled a database of those in the village over 10 years ago so that information could be passed quickly and so that we had relevant information on those living in the village in case of an emergency. Not everyone is on our database and only those who wish to receive updates, security messages or notice of events are listed. Of course, anyone who does not have access to a computer, or who does not use the internet, is also not on the database.

INFORMATION WE COLLECT

Personal Information. You will previously have given consent for your e-mail to be entered on the Elmore Parish Council Database. You provided us with your name and email address; we already have your postal address from the Electoral Roll forwarded to us by Stroud District Council. In some cases we may have personal telephone numbers, but only those that appear in the published Telephone Books and other open documents or where these have been provided to us in the past by yourselves. We do not collect personal information considered to be sensitive, such as health-related matters, dates of birth, martial status, occupation or any information related to finance.

We <u>never</u> share your information with any other individual, third party, agency or organisation without your prior consent.

HOW WE USE YOUR INFORMATION

We use your information for the following purposes only:

- To provide you with the relevant local security information, such as suspicious vehicle activity or crime in the local area.
- To provide you with information on road closures, bridge closures and related highway activity that may affect your travel arrangements.
- To inform you about local events that either may be of interest or when someone in the village has requested that information be made available to others. This may include:
 - Events at Elmore Village Hall,
 - Parish Council Meetings,
 - Special events at the Church.
 - Notices about deaths and funeral arrangements concerning parishioners.

Electronic Communications. Consistent with the above, we will communicate with you via electronic messages; i.e. e-mail, or text message if we have your permission to do so.

Our Role as Data Controller. We generally act as the data controller of your information.

Retention. We will retain your information for the period necessary to fulfill the purposes outlined above in this Policy and as otherwise needed to comply with applicable law. We will delete all information from the database if you request that we do so or when you move from the Village.
