From the Editor

What does the future hold for Elmore?

In the context of considering 'the future' it is necessary to address the issue of whether or not we will have a Parish Council. At the moment we have 5 Parish Councillors who stand for election every 4 years and a Parish Clerk who acts as the 'officer' of the Council. Councillors are 'apolitical' – that is, they do not represent any particular political party and all of them are volunteers who do not claim any expenses.

We are a small village with approximately 220 adults and children living here. Within the village there are several other committees made up of volunteers, for example; the Village Hall Committee and the Parochial Church Council. It is therefore difficult for all these committees to function without willing volunteers but it is inevitable that some people retire from their posts so replacements need to be found.

This year the Parish Councillors all stood for re-election and despite several attempts at advertising we only got one willing volunteer to come forward. Let me be brutally practical Several members of the Parish Council have served for over 12 years and have done more than their fair share, one Councillor is now 70 years old and seeks to retire at some stage over the next 4 years and I too wish to retire at the next election.

What happens if we do not get enough willing replacements? One obvious option is to amalgamate with another village: For several years the Parish Council of our neighbouring village has suggested that we amalgamate our councils thus increasing the pool of volunteers, while also cutting down the commitment and saving a paid Clerk's post. The precedent already exists within the Severn Voice Group of Parishes with Longney & Epney Parish Council as well as Fretherne with Saul Parish Council.

At any stage outside an election year we can co-opt a councillor providing they are willing to serve so if anyone feels the urge to serve the community please contact either myself or the Parish Clerk.

Broadband – An 'downbeat' update

Sadly, no tangible practical progress has been made since the last issue of **The Bridge** <u>but</u> there is some light at the end of the tunnel! Gloucestershire County Council (GCC) has promised to include Elmore in the Fastershire Programme – we do not yet know when this will take place as GCC are awaiting the costings from BT so that they can be included in the budget. BT promised to provide this information in February but as yet has failed to do so.

Our MP, Neil Carmichael, has also been chasing BT on our behalf but the reply he got from BT was far from helpful as can be seen from the letter below:

"Dear Neil, Thanks for your email regarding your constituent - Mr Field. Mr Field is connected to the Hardwicke exchange and served by cabinet 1. I'm pleased to say that the Hardwicke exchange is enabled for fibre based services which means that faster broadband speeds are available to many people in the area. Whilst I appreciate UK consumers are keen to benefit from fibre broadband, the upgrade process is both commercially and technically very challenging. As a result, this particular cabinet does not meet our supplier's (Openreach) criteria to be considered for inclusion in our commercial rollout plans. You may already know that, where cabinets are not commercially viable, Government funding is available through the BDUK (Broadband Delivery UK) programme. In Mr Field's area this is managed by the Fastershire project www.fastershire.com which aims to increase coverage in the region up to 95%.

I've checked with Matthew (Lloyd) and Paul (Coles) (as mentioned by Mr Field) and can confirm that we're still working with the Fastershire team to identify a solution. Mr Field should keep in touch with the Fastershire team directly.

Other Solutions

If Mr Field can't wait for a solution to be delivered through Fastershire he may wish to consider a privately funded solution with the backing of his community.

In some 90 locations we have worked with the communities directly and delivered fibre broadband sooner than would otherwise have been possible. Our ambition is to 'never say no' and if the local community is interested in this option then they can start the process by visiting

We'll be happy to engage with them and advise of the sum they will need to contribute.

Many of my observations on this letter from BT have been censored by The Editor but I will share with you one or two:

The cost of a privately funded solution for the installation of fibre into Elmore is in the region of £35,000 so is well beyond our meagre income. However, if BT is prepared to consider a privately funded

solution then they cannot on the other hand tell us that it is 'technically very challenging'. What they really mean to say is that we are too small to be considered as a viable commercial investment.

The Openreach Cabinet 1 is situated adjacent to the T junction this side of The Pilot near the new microwave dish on the pole and currently serves Longney for their faster Broadband!

The microwave pole carrying the broadband receiver is actually situated inside Elmore Parish boundary and until 8th |January this year we were to be included in the 'cutting edge' technology of firing the broadband signal via microwave.

I will continue to liaise with GCC/Fastershire Team and our MP as well as hassling BT to keep the project alive.
