13. Flood Defences	John Field had written to the Environment Agency (EA) as directed by	
and the Environment	EPC at the March meeting concerning proposals for the New Flood Risk	
Agency's Plans for	Strategy.	
Elmore - Update	JF has only received a written reply that day (14 th May); he gave a short	
_	resumé of the reply which included the following facts:	
	The EA stated that the flood defences in the Elmore would last until the	
	year 2060.	
	The EA stated that the current flood risk in Elmore was 1 in 50 however, he	
	pointed out that history has proved this statistic incorrect.	
	JF stated that flood resilience measures might be a key factor for homes	
	near the River.	
	Despite the apparent improvement in future flood risk JF stated that there	
	had been no real change since the publication of the EA's Report in	
	January 2011. The EA have now managed to make the situation appear	
	better by interpreting the 'risk' in a different way which resulted in a lower	
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	sea level rise over the next 100 years (now 0.7m rather than 1m). This	
	apparent reduced sea level rise meant that less area would be flooded along	
	Severn Estuary and fewer hectares of wildlife habitat would need to be	
	reclaimed elsewhere, such as Elmore Back.	
	An open village meeting with the EA is due to be arranged so the	
	parishioners can discuss the issues and try to make progress about the	
	future maintenance of the River Severn flood defences.	
	JF restated the ideas which were sent to the EA and highlighted the EA's	
	responses and these were discussed:	
	Status Quo – (The EA continues to maintain the flood defences as at	
	present). EA stated that there is no public funding available for this option.	
	Status Quo Plus – (The EA continues to maintain the flood defences and	
	reacts to trigger points such a sea level rises) Again, funding is the issue,	
	there is no guarantee that any future maintenance of flood defences will be	
	carried out.	
	Managed Retreat – (The EA clearly identifies the areas they consider	
	uneconomical then puts plans in place to protect dwellings, farms etc) Once	

again funding is the issue. There are grants available to help homeowners by the EA is not responsible for them. The only way funding will become available for major flood defence work is by the creation of wildlife habitats. This can only be done with the consent of landowners who agree that their land can be flooded to create saltmarsh grazing or wildlife habitats

Maintenance by Proxy – (The responsibility for maintenance is taken over by a third party e.g. GCC, SDC, landowners, local businesses and tenant farmers with the funds previously available to Defra and EA). Needless to say that the funding issue blocks this option too.

In short, the EA is abrogating any responsibility for maintaining flood defences along the River Severn in line with their 'permissive powers'.

JF has been involved in the drafting of a letter to our local MP from the Severn Voice parishes to and explain how we are not happy with the EA's approach and are far from any progress being made.

JF will keep interested parties updated as new information becomes available.

14. The need for an Elmore Emergency Plan - Update

Following on from the discussion of this topic at the last EPC meeting, JF has revisited the need for Elmore Parish to have an Emergency Plan. JF recommended that it would be prudent to have one as Elmore Village has come near to having emergencies and disasters in the past.

In view of this; JF has started to compile a draft document. A hard copy for comments will be sent round in due course. He highlighted the objectives and possible emergencies that might be covered in such a plan:

Objectives of this Plan

- Identify what risks the community could face
- Highlight relevant response actions for each type of risk
- Identify vulnerable groups in the community
- Identify resources in the community available to assist during an emergency
- Provide key contact details for the Community Response Group, Key Community Resources, the Emergency Services and Local Authorities

Possible Emergencies. The types of emergencies that would have an impact on our community are shown below. These emergencies have been placed in categories to indicate their likelihood based on past experience:

Category 1 – Highly likely to happen and has happened before

- Flooding overtopping of the flood defences on the River Severn. (1947, 1965, 1999 & 2002)
- Flooding surface water caused by heavy rain (e.g. as per the floods in July 2007)
- Farm diseases which affect movement and isolate parts of the community. (e.g. Foot & Mouth)

Category 2 – Possible

- Extreme weather heavy snow storms which overload the road clearing services.
- Extreme weather Storms/wind damage and tree blow-down which blocks roads.
- Power failure widespread failure over a lengthy period especially

	Category 3 – Remote possibility

	expected that there may be a 5% increase in the price as the process of	
	research and preparation of a grant application to the War Memorials Trust	
	(WMT) has taken time, leading to approximately the final cost being about	
	£725. On 14 th March 2012, we were offered a grant from the WMT which	
	will be paid into our bank account on proof of satisfactory completion of	
	the work. TJ has returned a declaration form, signed by McAllister	
	Masonry to WMT stating that they understand the conditions governing	
	grant aided work.	
	As far as WMT is concerned, we may now go ahead to complete the work	
	and we have one year to achieve this. A letter was sent to Elmore Land	
	Charity requesting a grant of £137 towards the work, we are awaiting a	
	reply. £150 has also been set aside from EPC to help with the cost of the	
	work.	
	JF proposed for an increase of £50 for the work from EPC to allow from a	
	possible increase in process since the original quote and for McAllister to
